Helena Bergius, RN, M. S.c, Nurse Manager at the Hospital Managed Advanced Homecare Programme for Children (SABH), Astrid Lindgren Children's Hospital, Karolinska University Hospital. SABH provides 24/7 care for patients age 0-18 years in need of early palliative care and end-of-life care. Helena has a long experience of leadership and managing. She participated in the Palliative Care Education and Practice course (PCEP) at Harvard, Boston 2015-2016. She is one of the initiators of creating a multi-professional Palliative Network at the Astrid Lindgren Children's Hospital.



Annika Bjurö Svensson, MD, specialist in Oncology and in Palliative Medicine. Annika is a senior consultant at ASIH Lund, a palliative home care team available 24/7 for seriously ill patients of all ages and with any diagnose. She was one of the driving forces in expanding the care from adults only to include children also. Annika has, together with Karin Bäckdahl, been involved in teaching palliative care on a national level.



Karin Bäckdahl, MD, pediatrician and specialist in palliative medicine. Karin has been consultant (överläkare) and medically responsible physician at Lilla Erstagården Children and Youth hospice since 2013. Lilla Erstagården cares for children and adolescents in early and late palliative phase, as well as in end-of-life. She participated in the course Palliative Care Education and Practice (PCEP) at Harvard 2015-2016. Karin has been teaching pediatric palliative and symptom relief both nationally and internationally for many years. Since 2015, she has introduced annual multi-professional lectures on pediatric palliative at "Barnveckan", but is also teaching at the Nordic Specialist Course in Palliative Medicines.



Ulrika Kreicbergs, RN, PhD, holds a professorship, in palliative care for children and youth at Marie Cederschiöld University, Palliative Research Centre and is also associated to Karolinska Institutet. Dr Kreicbergs graduated as a registered nurse in 1987 and took her PhD at Karolinska Institutet in 2004. She has been working clinically in pediatric oncology. Her research is on the child and family in palliative care and focuses on factors in the health care and family that can be modified or avoided to reduce suffering and thereby enhance quality of life for the child and their families.



Ulrika Larsson has worked as a specialist nurse in pediatric oncology at Drottning Silvia's Children's Hospital in Gothenburg since 1989. Ulrika has worked as a consulting nurse for 12 years.



Malin Lövgren, RN, PhD is an Associate professor in palliative care at Marie Cederschiöld University, Palliative Research Center and Head of Research and Care development at Advanced Pediatric Home Care, Astrid Lindgren Children's hospital, Karolinska University hospital. Malin took her PhD at Karolinska Institutet in 2009. Her research focuses on palliative care involving families with dependent children, complex interventions, psychosocial care, end-of-life communication, and grief.



Margaretha Stenmarker, MD, PhD, and associate professor in paediatrics at the Department of Paediatrics, Institute of Clinical Sciences, University of Gothenburg. She is deputy Director at Futurum – the academy for health and care, Region Jönköping County (RJL) and is a medical specialist in “Paediatrics” and “Paediatric Haematology and Oncology”. She works as a senior consultant at the Department of Paediatrics, RJL, at the Late-Effect Clinic, Sahlgrenska University Hospital, Gothenburg, and as a medical consultant at the Late-Effect Clinic, in south-eastern Sweden. Her research is in the field of psychosocial paediatric oncology with focus on professional challenges and quality of life during and after cancer treatment in childhood.



Petter Svenberg MD, is a specialist in pediatric oncology and chief physician at Astrid Lindgren's Children's Hospital, Karolinska University Hospital. He holds courses for future pediatricians and pediatric nurses in "the difficult conversation".



Eduard Verhagen, is a pediatrician at the University Medical Center Groningen (Netherlands). Dr Verhagen worked for 5 years in Curaçao (Caribbean) before he came to Groningen to work at the Beatrix Children's Hospital, where he is now a Professor of Pediatric Palliative Care and the Department Chair. He received his MD and JD from the University of Utrecht and completed his specialty training in Amsterdam. His PhD thesis was on neonatal end-of-life decisions in Dutch NICU's. His area of interest is ethical decision-making and end-of-life care and leads research and palliative care initiatives. He is member of several national and governmental medical-ethical and legal advice councils.



Prof. Dr. Boris Zernikow is the Director of the Department of Psychosomatic Medicine, Pain Therapy and Palliative Care at the Children's Hospital Datteln, Witten/Herdecke University, Germany; Chair of Children's Pain Therapy and Paediatric Palliative Care (First Chair Position in Europe). He is certified medical specialist in “Paediatrics” authorized for further professional training in “Palliative Care”, “Specified Pain Therapy” and “Paediatric Haematology and Oncology”. Four times (2008, 2012, 2013, 2021) he received the science award of the German Palliative Care Association. In 2015 as the first medical doctor in the history of the award he was honoured with the Communicator Award, conferred by German Research Foundation.
